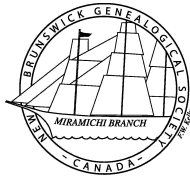

**Requesting Help!**  
**Please Help Us to Help You.**

It has come to our attention that the new death certificates posted at PANB Online often contain the place of burial of the deceased. Some of our members have been sending us this information when they discover that it is missing from our cemetery transcriptions.

Often, as we transcribed the tombstones, we noted that several stones seemed to be missing or they had deteriorated to the point where they could not be read. As well, people were sometimes buried with no marker. These, of course, are not included in our cemetery transcriptions.

We are currently updating our records with new tombstone information and also with some church records that we have been able to obtain for people buried with no stone. We would really appreciate it if you would take the time to send us any **Northumberland County** records you locate of burials that are **NOT** listed in our cemetery publications.

## **WHO WAS THE FIRST SCOT IN NEW BRUNSWICK?**

The pioneering Scottish lumberman, shipbuilder and politician, William Davidson, was barely 25 years old when he settled near Miramichi in 1765. Davidson is generally credited with being the first Scot to settle in New Brunswick, but was there a Scot who came before him? If you know the answer and think you can prove it, you could win a \$500 contest prize or an IPAD2 being offered by the New Brunswick Scottish Web Portal.

A press conference to announce the details of the contest and featuring the great-great-great-great-grandson of William Davidson, Mr. Brad Sturgeon of Fredericton, will be held at 2 pm, Thursday, January 24, 2013 at the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick in Fredericton.

The Scottish Web Portal is an initiative of several Scottish cultural organizations in partnership with the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick. The Portal will be a virtual showcase of all things Scottish in New Brunswick and has been in development for more than two years.

One of its major features will be a searchable 1851 and 1861 census, focusing on Scottish born immigrants to the province. Other highlights include searchable land grants and teacher's petitions, passenger lists, family and community histories as well as publications, oral history interviews, and membership lists from the various Scottish organizations dating back to the settlement of the province in the late 1700s.

Dan Taylor of New Maryland is chair of the Web Portal Committee. He says the mystery of who was the first Scottish person to settle in New Brunswick is one that has never been fully addressed by historians, probably because Davidson's impact on the Miramichi area has been so well documented and because Scots often self-identified as "British". "The archival evidence is indisputable that Davidson was the first Scot to settle in Miramichi," Taylor says "but it is hard to believe that no other Scottish-born person made his or her way to this area before 1765. Even the Irish are known to have been in Acadia as early as 1608," he says. Knowing the Scottish propensity to exploration and discovery, Taylor says the Committee feels certain that somewhere out there is a family member, genealogist, historian or researcher who can help solve the mystery of the first Scot to settle in New Brunswick.

Contest details are available on the New Brunswick Scottish Cultural Association website at [www.nbscots.ca](http://www.nbscots.ca) The contest runs from Robbie Burns Day, January 25, 2013 through to St. Andrews Day, November 30, 2013. The winner will be announced on December 13, 2013.

## **COMMUNITY PLACE NAMES IN NEW BRUNSWICK, CANADA:**

(Extractions with permission of Robert F. Fellows)

**East Beaver Brook:** Settlement, 2 mi. E of Beaver Brook Station: Newcastle Parish, Northumberland County: today East Beaver Brook is a dispersed community.

**East Collette:** Settlement, 2 mi. NE of Collette: Rogersville Parish, Northumberland County: PO 1916-1950: today East Collette is a dispersed community.

**East Rogersville:** Former settlement, 2 mi. NE of Rogersville, on road to Rosaireville: Rogersville Parish, Northumberland County: PO *East Rogerville* 1884-1950: in 1898 "East Rogerville" was a farming and lumbering settlement with 1 post office and a population of 200: PO *East Rogersville* 1950-1951: it became part of Shediac Ridge.

**Eel Ground:** Settlement, 3 mi. W of Northwest Bridge, on road to Strathadam: Northesk Parish, Northumberland County: today Eel Ground is a dispersed community.

**Eel Ground Indian Reserve #2:** On the N bank of the Northwest Miramichi River, 3 mi. SW of Newcastle and 2 mi. NW of Derby Junction: Northesk Parish, Northumberland County: it was established in 1789 with 2,682 acres of land.

**Eel River:** See Hardwicke (Hardwicke Parish, Northumberland County)

**Eel River Bridge:** Settlement on Baie-Sainte-Anne, 2 mi. S of Hardwicke, on the road to Manuels: Hardwick Parish, Northumberland County: PO 1906-

1968: today Eel River Bridge is a dispersed community.

**Elizabethton:** Former settlement, 5 mi. NE of Beaver Brook Station: Newcastle Parish, Northumberland County: it was named for Queen Elizabeth and Princess Elizabeth: PO 1939-1940.

**Ellenstown:** See Williamstown (Southesk Parish, Northumberland County)

**Elliott Landing:** See Ferry Road (Newcastle Parish, Northumberland County)

**Ellison Settlement:** See Allison Settlement (Northesk Parish, Northumberland County)

**Elmtree:** Settlement on N side of Southwest Miramichi River, 2 mi. E of Quarryville, on road to Upper Derby: Derby Parish, Northumberland County: included community of Davidson: today Elmtree is a dispersed community.

**English Settlement:** See Wayerton (Northesk Parish, Northumberland County)

**Escuminac:** Settlement on Miramichi Bay, 2 mi. NE of Baie-Sainte-Anne, on the road to Point Escuminac: Hardwicke Parish, Northumberland County: name was derived from the Micmac word for "lookout place": it was settled in 1785: PO 1858-1968: in 1866 Escuminac was a farming and fishing community with about 38 families including 7 McLean families: in 1898 it had 1 post office, 1 store, 1 hotel, 1 lobster factory, 1 church and a population of 150: included Bransfield: named for Michael Bransfield, a settler: PO 1884-1968: in 1898 Bransfield was a farming and lumbering settlement with 1 post office, 1 church and a population of 150: also included the community of Lower Escuminac: PO 1908-1968: today Escuminac is a dispersed community.

**Etiennes Point:** See Cains Point (Alnwick Parish, Northumberland County)

**Exmoor:** Settlement, 3 mi. N of Sunny Corner, on the road to Big Hole: Northesk Parish, Northumberland County: first called Meadows: in 1871 Meadows had a population of 60: settlement was renamed with creation of the post office: PO *Exmoor* 1892-1951: in 1898 Exmoor was a farming, lumbering settlement with 1 post office and a population of 75: today it is a dispersed community.

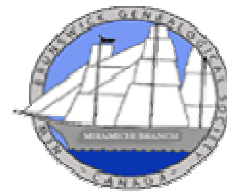

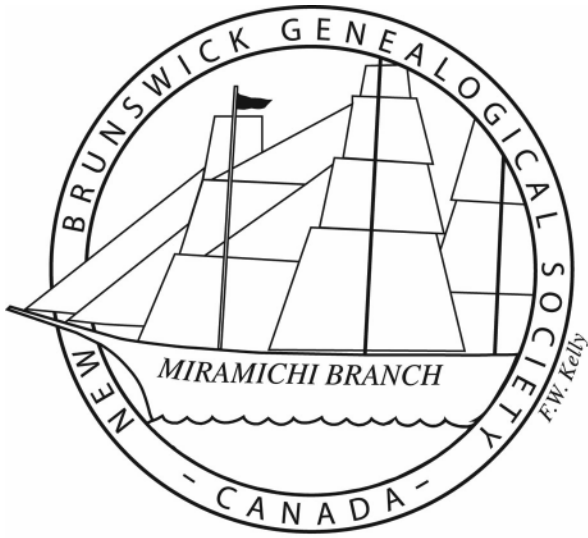
